A native San Diegan, Jonathan moved to New York City in 1996 to dance for five years in the record breaking Broadway Company of *CATS*. After a short stint in the Broadway National Tour of Disney's *BEAUTY AND THE BEAST*, he joined the Broadway revival cast of *42<sup>ND</sup> STREET*, performing for the entire four-year run. The La Jolla Playhouse featured Jonathan in *THE WIZ*, directed by Des McAnuff, and most recently in the Broadway hit, *MEMPHIS*.

Adult Ensemble meets every Wed. evening 6:30 -8:30 pm. Regular attendance is required and a commitment to rehearsals and performances as necessary. Adult Ensemble is composed of dancers aged 18 and older. They help the San Diego Civic Dance Company represent the City of San Diego at public events while receiving advanced training. To become a member of the Adult Ensemble, dancers must attend and complete this nine week workshop in which they will be tested in tap and jazz technique.

**Current Adult Ensemble members will be required to attend this workshop and re-audition every year.**
