

# T-Troupe Workshop with Kathy Landry

## 2024-2025 Season

T-Troupe is composed of dancers aged 8 to 12 yrs old who are the Junior Company for the San Diego Parks & Recreation's Civic Dance Arts. They help the San Diego Civic Dance Company represent the City of San Diego at public events, conventions, benefits, and community events, while receiving advanced training. Most T-Troupe members go on to join the San Diego Civic Dance Company, the senior performance group.

To become a member of T-Troupe, dancers must attend and complete an eight-week workshop in which they will be tested in tap, jazz, and ballet technique. At the end of the eight-week workshop, dancers will audition.
