Instructions for San Diego Civic Dance Association Bonnie Ward Memorial Scholarship

Mission Statement: Our mission is to support and promote a premiere dance arts program and an appreciation of the arts, in cooperation with the San Diego Park and Recreation Department Dance Arts Program.

The SDCDA Scholarship Program is funded by generous donations and grants and is subject to availability of funds.

I. Purpose of the Fund is:

- 1. To encourage higher education and promote dance excellence, as always encouraged by Bonnie Ward.
- 2. To provide scholarship stipends for dance instruction and higher education for San Diego Civic Dance Company members who have demonstrated exemplary interest, attendance, cooperation and dedication to their dance studies.

II. Goals of the Fund are:

- 1. To reward the fine character and standard as exemplified by Bonnie Ward.
- 2. To build character derived from being an exemplary San Diego Civic Dance Arts member. Very dramatic changes occur in young people who strive to live up to a standard set for them. It is important to take note of these character traits and give a meaningful award that will attract more of our younger students to aspire to a higher standard of life.
- 3. To perpetuate the fund.
- 4. To provide an incentive for students in the San Diego Civic Dance Arts to excel in dance and achieve their full potential and enhance their appreciation of dance.

III. Classifications of Eligibility

- 1. Graduating High School Seniors and Post High School Graduates** of one year may apply if they meet the following minimum requirements.
 - a) Must be a member of San Diego Civic Dance Company.
 - b) Must have been enrolled in the San Diego Civic Dance Arts for the last three consecutive years.
 - c) Must have maintained a 90% attendance record with minimal to zero tardiness all year round for those years.
 - d) Must have demonstrated interest in the San Diego Civic Dance Arts by having cooperated with instructors, staff, fellow students, and volunteers, as well as having shown a dedication to dance.
 - e) Must have demonstrated Company leadership and mentoring qualities and involvement in the San Diego Civic Dance Arts program over and above the basic contract commitment of San Diego Civic Dance Company.
 - f) Must not have been a Bonnie Ward Scholarship Recipient in the past year.
 - g) Eligibility for any SDCDA scholarship requires applicant and their immediate family be in good financial standing with the San Diego Civic Dance Association, Inc. and the San Diego Civic Dance Arts Program

**Please note: Applicants for the Post High School Graduate Scholarship(s) will be required to attach a certified copy of their grading report from the college or university attended commencing the fall after high school graduation, along with current proof of enrollment and carrying a minimum of nine (9) units with a minimum 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA).

IV. Application Instructions: ALL APPLICATIONS WILL RECEIVE A CONFIRMATION OF RECIEPT WITHIN ONE WEEK OF SUBMITTAL. If you do not receive one, please notify <u>sdcdascholarships@gmail.com</u> immediately. We are not responsible for lost emails or mail. All applications MUST be received by the dates noted below. Please allow for enough time to receive in a timely manner.

Please note: San Diego Civic Dance Scholarships are a competitive process. Applications and essays are scored by the interviewing panel and should be complete, with attention to detail in all directions as noted in this application. There are NO exceptions to the application process. You must be available for an in-person interview on April 28th, 2018.

Applications are accepted during the application period of November 8, 2017 - Feb 8, 2018. Applications will be available online on our website at www.civicdancearts.org. or from your dance instructor. As San Diego Civic Dance cares for the environment, preferred method of submittal is electronic (via email).

Requests for letters of recommendation from SDCDArts Staff must be requested by January 8, 2018. Staff will be instructed to email letter to both applicant and <u>sdcdascholarships@gmail.com</u>. Letters of recommendation may be received after you have submitted application, but must be received by application deadline.

If you are unable to email your application, you may mail your completed application and essay to San Diego Civic Dance Association, Attn: Scholarship Committee, 2125 Park Blvd., San Diego, CA 92101. You will receive an email or mailed confirmation (if no access to email) within a week of mailed receipt.

Applications must be postmarked by Thursday, February 8, 2018. Do not turn your application in to your teacher. Your teacher WILL NOT accept it.

Application Submission/Interview Requirements:

(Submission deadline Feb 8, 2018, Interviews April 28, 2018)

Please note, only the following formats will be accepted for applications and essays: Word doc or pdf. All other formats may result in application being disqualified.

Please do not submit copies of transcripts, award letters or documentation not specifically required by this application package.

- 1. Submit completed application
- 2. Request and/or submit one or more letters of recommendation from SDCDArts Staff or School/Extracurricular Activities. Please note, letters of recommendation may be received after your application, but before the final deadline.
- 3. Submit Personal Essay/Letter to Scholarship Review Board. (include with application package) In your essay, tell us a little about yourself. Discuss how your involvement with San Diego Civic Dance Arts and Company has impacted your life, why you should be considered for this scholarship, how you have been a leader and a mentor in this program and explain your expectations for the future. Your essay should be typed, double spaced and 1-2 pages in length. <u>DO NOT INCLUDE</u> your full name, family member names or where you attend school.
- 4. Each eligible applicant will be required to be present at an interview, with the date and time set by the Scholarship Committee. You will be notified of your interview time. Interviews will be held in person on Sat April 28th, 2018 starting at 8:30 am. There will be no exceptions to these dates.

Interviews and Awards

You will be contacted via email to schedule and confirm your interview time. We make every effort to schedule around SDCDA classes so that you do not miss your class. Interviews can run between 20-40 minutes each. Headshots for publicity will be taken at the interview and displayed in the lobby of theater for the run of recitals. Notifications of award status will be emailed out by May 14th, 2018. Scholarship awards are presented in the Casa Del Prado Theater during recitals (date and time will be announced in your award notifications. Awarded funds will be paid out in the form of reimbursement within 10 days of awardee submittal of approved reimbursement paperwork.

Bonnie Ward scholarship awards and amounts are determined yearly based upon total of qualified field of candidates, applications, interviews and recommendations. If awarded a scholarship, in order to receive payment, each Graduating Senior and/or Post High School Graduate awarded a scholarship must provide the San Diego Civic Dance Association Scholarship Committee with a certified copy of the grading report, received from the college or university attended, commencing in the fall after receiving this scholarship, and showing a minimum student load of nine (9) units with a minimum 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA).
