Young Adult Ensemble meets every Thursday evening 8-10pm. Regular attendance is required and a
commitment to rehearsals and performances as necessary. Young Adult Ensemble is composed of dancers
aged 18 and older. They help the San Diego Civic Dance Company represent the City of San Diego at public
events while receiving advanced training. To become a member of the Young Adult Ensemble, dancers
must attend and complete this nine-week workshop in which they will be tested in tap and jazz technique.
Current Young Adult Ensemble members will be required to attend this workshop and re-audition every year.
